Sir,

In continuation of my despatch No. 543 dated 15th Ultimo, I am directed by the Right Honble. the Governor in Council to communicate for the information of the Government of India, the accompanying Copy of a letter from the Commander in Chief of the Indian Navy, No. 484 dated 20th Idem, reporting as to the propriety or expediency of the Commodore in Command of the Corian Gulf Squadron being able to shift his broad Pendant from one vessel to another, as the service may require.

With regard to the Commodore shifting his Flag from one Ship to another, His Lordship in Council instructs me to observe that if the Command Allowance can be permitted to be drawn for one ship of the Squadron.

Squadron, doubly, there would no longer be any difficulty; because the Commodore could then transfer himself to any ship he may select without suffering loss himself, or entailing loss and inconvenient derangement upon other Officers.

Sir,

I have the honor to submit, for the information of His Lordship in Council copy of a communication, with inclosures, N^o 260 of 1855, addressed by the late Resident Captain Kimball, to His Excellency Mr. Murray, exhibiting the steps he felt himself bound to adopt for the purpose of again checking the mischievous spirit of the Ak Ali and Ras Coomait guilty of disorder last year on the Pearl Banks.

I beg also to enclose transcript of a despatch from Her Majesty's Minister in reply to the above communication entirely approving of the judicious measures taken by Captain Kimball to procure the peace of the Gulf.

In enclosing the said correspondence it is but right and just I should mention that, independent of the evident necessity, that existed for the employment, should it need be, of steps of unusual stringency to bring the refractory States to their bearing, the Kingah chief personally invited the interference of the British by expressing to the Resident, in a letter he addressed him, his inability to control his dependents, the Bas Sornaites, and permission moreover was granted by a former Governor of Persia to the British authorities in the Gulf to repress the maritime disorders and irregularities that might, perchance, be committed by the inhabitants of the Ports on the Persian Coast.

My despatch to the address of His Excellency Mr. Murray N. 316 of 24th ultimo which forms enclosure 4 to my communication to Mr. Secretary Anderson N. 778, on this subject, will apprise His Majesty's Council that, owing to the orderly behaviour of the Bas Sornaites and M. M. Tribes on the Pearl Banks, the employment of coercive measures had up to date evidently not been required to restrain them.
