Substance of Intelligence supplied to
the Presidency this day (January 16) by
the British Agent at Shiraz.

The Whicoray Gazette that reached
this today contains the following items
of Intelligence.

Abdol Babae Merza, son of
the Prince Governor of Fars, arrived at
Shiraz on the 1st. January express
from Shiraz in 5 days.

Merza Mahomed Khan,
Sir Kashehcheer-tashee, & Fuzl alie
Khan, father of the Sirteep lately
deceased in Bushire, are under orders
to proceed to Fars with the troops &
they Command viz. Merza Mahomed
Khan with 5,000 men & 5 Guns.

Fuzl the Khan also with
5,000 men & 5 Guns.

Merza Ibrahim Khan,
Sirteep, Jafar, that likewise been
ordered to Fars with three Regiments
from Isfahan.

Suleymān Khan, Afshar,
with 700 Afshar horse, & 1 Regiment
Infantry (likewise Afsharis) has

arrived

arrived in Shiraz, & proceeds in attendance upon the Prince Governor of Fars to the scene of warfare.

Mr. R. H. will march from the Dil-Aksha Gardens tomorrow the 9th (Sunnadee or Monday, 5th January), will visit Saby, Poshan, & thence, march with all speed.

The Khan, Sirdar of the Hamadance Regiment, accompanies the Prince with 2 Regiments.

The force in attendance upon Mr. R. H. is as follows.

Suleyman Khan with 700 Afshar Horse & 1 Regiment Afshar Infantry. 500 more Household Cavalry. The Khan, Sirdar with 2 Hamadance Regiments.

10 Guns with proposition of Gunners.

Three Orders of honor have been brought from the Capital, one for the Shoja, or Muzli, one for Hajee Mahomed Bashim Khan, a member of Council Chamber, & one for Mirza Nassir, in whose hands is the transmission of all artillery stores.

Khan, Sirtop, deceased, has been
nominated to the post of his Brother,
is coming to join the Kara-daghee
Regiment with Clothing & muskets.

I before reported to you the
strength of the Force with the Sherja-
al-mulk. The Col Khanee has under
his Command, 1500 Horsemen. His
foot soldiers have all been pressed
into service, & are exceedingly weak.

The Prince delayed 2 days get-
ting ready Sulyman Khan's horse
Yesterday the 11th Instant he
proceeded to Gujarut, and marched
via Jirch, Furrashbund, & Boshkoom.

His Majesty has sent the Prince
a present of a sword.

I have the honor to forward for information the accompanying letter from the Third Lieutenant of this Ship; it appears from an enquiry that no case of "duch-munk" on the part of the Persians was given as from the testimony of Dr. Thresh and Mr. Bennett Pinder who were both in the Boat when it occurred, there can be little doubt but that the stone was wilfully thrown and likewise by one of the soldiers.

Sir

I beg to bring to your notice that yesterday being in charge of the 2nd cutter on duty, for the purpose of bringing off Treasure to the ship, just as the Boat was

was about to shove off from the Bunder, some
 stones and mud were thrown at me by one of the
 Persian soldiers, who was standing with many
 other soldiers round about the Quay, without any
 provocation whatever from me. - I beg to state
 that I was in uniform and the Boat's Ensign
 was flying at the Mizzen Mast. I at once landed
 and without further molestation walked up
 to the Presidency and reported the circumstance to
 the President.
