On the eve of your departure
you will acquaint the Governor of
Azerbaijan that you have been instructed
to quit Persia in consequence of the
course which the Persian Government
pursued in following, with regard to
Herat and other matters in discussion
between Great Britain and Persia, &
you will understand that you are
not to be induced by any assurances
tendered to you by the Persian Court
to abstain from commencing your
journey to Bagdad as soon as you
are ready to set out.

You will acquaint any
British subjects who may be at
Tabreez with your approaching
departure, and, if they determine
to accompany you, you will permit
them to do so; or, if they prefer to
remain, you will request the French
Minister to protect them during the
absence of the British Mission from
Persia.

You will be careful not
to give to any person whatever the
slightest

slightest intimation of the intention of Her Majesty's Government to have recourse to coercive measures in the Persian Gulf.

It is not intended at present to withdraw the East India Company's Agent at Bushire, and the presence of the British Force in the Gulf will be sufficient to protect him from insult or injury; though if he has reason to apprehend danger before the Force arrives, he will have permission to place himself and his establishment in safety.

We transmit for your information and guidance, a copy of a despatch, dated the 22nd instant, which the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has addressed to Her Majesty's Consuls at Tebran and Tabreez directing them to withdraw from the Persian dominions, and a copy of a letter, dated the 26th instant, which has been sent by order of the Earl of Clarendon, to the Board of Commissioners for the affairs of India, requiring that the expedition which will have been prepared under our instructions of the 22nd of July, shall, as soon as it can be completed, proceed to its destination in the Gulf of Persia.

Instructions will forthwith be transmitted by us, through Bagdad, to the East India Company's Resident at Bushire, in accordance with the suggestion contained

in the last paragraph of the enclosed
letter of the 22?

In a fortunate hour I was gratified by the receipt of your letter, and understood its contents, & that you therefore expressed touching our friendly relations is fully reciprocated by me. I before addressed you two letters on matters which it is superfluous to repeat; for when you made a reference to me regarding Bin Mijdel, I informed you how for a considerable time he took asylum with Sheikh Allaheed ben Kher befarin Bahrein, at whose instigation and with whose encouragement it was he committed disorders at sea, how I sent him out and confiscated his estate, as well on account of his Maritime irregularities as of his having sought refuge with that chief, all of which is known to you. Also how he again placed himself under my protection, and I bound him by an engagement to restore all that he had taken, at the instigation of the above mentioned, and not to repeat disorder at sea. I also acquainted you how the Auladi Kheleefa (chiefs of Bahrein) had cut off all communication with my Territories from without, in order that you might interdict them from so doing, but it (my representation) has had no effect. With regard to what you observe that
