IN continuation of my letter as per margin and previous correspondence, No. 943—247, dated the 5th June 1872, concerning the affairs in Nejd, I have the honor to enclose translated purport of a letter communicated to this Residency by the Bahrein news-writer.

News communicated by HAJEE ABDUL NUBBEE, to Residency Office on 25th June 1872.

THE following is what has been communicated to me from Bahrein :

At this date, viz. 12th *Rubeoos Sance* (corresponding to the 19th June 1872.)—Fifteen persons bound as prisoners of the people of Lahsa, were brought and sent to Baghdad in a Turkish Government steamer. I could not learn the names of the prisoners ; but if I do learn, I will let you know.

A messenger from Saood has just arrived, and states that Saood and his brother intend to meet at Boohichfan, a watering place between Lahsa and Reaz.

As soon as I hear intelligence of their having met, I shall let you know.

REFERRING to previous correspondence connected with the affairs of Bahrein in relation to the proceedings of the Turks in that quarter, I am directed to forward herewith, for the information of the Government of India, copy of a letter from the Political Resident in the Persian Gulf, No. 1046—274, dated 26th ultimo, submitting an extract from an unofficial letter received by him from Captain Grant, showing that a Turkish subject of Lahsa has obtained from the Chief of Bahrein a site for certain premises in the town of Menameh in the immediate vicinity of the Chief's own house or fort.
